Sneak Peek:

Coming off of an impressive sweep of nationally-ranked Dartmouth and Harvard last weekend, St. Lawrence will look to extend their six-game winning streak when they head to Princeton University and Quinnipiac University for a pair of ECAC Hockey contests.

Appleton Angels:

Appleton Arena continued to be one of the toughest venues for visiting teams last season, as the Saints posted a 15-5-1 record on their home ice. The Scarlet and Brown earned home wins against several impressive opponents, including No. 3 New Hampshire and No. 8 Dartmouth.

St. Lawrence swept their opening home series against Robert Morris by the combined tally of 10-1 two weekends ago. They then defeated No. 3 Dartmouth 3-0 and No. 4 Harvard 3-1 last weekend to remain perfect on their home ice.

Against the Top-10:

St. Lawrence played thirteen games against ranked opponents in 2007-08, including No. 3 New Hampshire, No. 3 Minnesota Duluth and conference foes Dartmouth, Harvard and Clarkson. The Scarlet and Brown finished with an overall mark of 5-7-1 against the top teams in the nation.

In their opening game against a top-10 foe this

season, the Saints fell to No. 4 New Hampshire at the Whittemore Center in Durham, NH by the score of 3-2. The Saints have since rebounded and are 2-1 against ranked opponents after sweeping nationally ranked Dartmouth and Harvard.

The Scarlet and Brown will continue to face stiff competition throughout the 2008-09 season, and are slated to take on nationally ranked Boston College, Clarkson and the Big Green and Crimson. They will also meet weekly vote-getters Ohio State and Mercyhurst in non-conference series.

A Dish Best Served Cold:

Revenge will be in the air this weekend as the Saints head to Princeton, NJ and Hamden, CT.

The Princeton Tigers have given the Saints all they can handle over the years, but his team suffered their worst defeat in the all-time series last year at Appleton Arena, 9-2. Princeton will be looking to avenge that loss and pick up their second win in three years at home against SLU (6-5 win in 2006-07).

Quinnipiac and their head coach may have revenge on the brain this weekend in Saturday's meeting with St. Lawrence. Quinnipiac is 0-6 against SLU, having been outscored 40-8 in the series. New head coach Rick Seeley was the head coach at Clarkson, and would surely like to pick up a win against his old conference rival.

Your Weekly Top-10:

This weeks USCHO.com and USA Today polls are once again very similar, with the nation's top teams continuing to separate themselves from the pack.

Wisconsin remains the undisputed No. 1 team in the land, followed by conference foe Minnesota in both polls. New Hampshire is third, followed by St. Lawrence, who jumped from No. 9 to No. 4 after sweeping Harvard and Dartmouth.

USCHO.com has the Terriers of Boston University narrowly ahead of the Big Green at No. 5, while USA Today has the teams flip flopped.

The polls agree that the defending champions from Minnesota Duluth, Boston College and Harvard hold down the No. 7-9 slots, respectively. However, USCHO.com has Mercyhurst at No. 10 while USA Today ranks the Clarkson Golden Knights at the final spot.

Wellsy's World:

After Paul Flanagan announced last spring that he'd be heading to Syracuse University to help start their women's hockey program, the St. Lawrence athletic department announced the hiring of Chris Wells. A Canton, NY native and 1992 graduate of St. Lawrence, Wells took over after serving five years as the Associate Head Coach of the men's hockey program.

Under Coach Wells, St. Lawrence has worked to bring intensity to both ends of the ice, as he consistently preaches back-checking by his forwards and sound special teams play.

Coach Wells is off to a very impressive start in his first season, as his team has climbed to the No. 4 ranking in the nation with a 7-1-2 record. He picked up his first career wins over Ivy foes Harvard and Dartmouth and will look to add points to the Saints' ECAC Hockey totals this weekend.

Congrats Carson!:

St. Lawrence University senior assistant captain Carson Duggan broke the University career-goals record against Dartmouth last Friday with a short-handed goal that ensured the team's upset win.

The goal, which came at 7:46 of the third period on Dartmouth goaltender Carli Clemis, was the 86th of Duggan's illustrious career. She passed former linemate Sabrina Harbec '05, then added to her total with a goal the following day against Harvard.

Champagne on Ice:

Captain Marianna Locke has pulled to within one point of the "Century Mark" for her career. The Brasher Falls, NY native has picked up 56 goals and 43 assists in 127 collegiate games, leaving her only a point shy of 100.

Locke is trying to become the 15th player in St. Lawrence history to record 100 career points.

There is also an intriguing race for the career power play goals record that is likely to last all season between Locke, Duggan and classmate Alison Domenico. Coming into the weekend, all three players are only one PP goal shy of Chelsea Grills' record of 25.

Streaking Saints:

St. Lawrence comes into the Princeton-Quinnipiac series with the nation's third-longest unbeaten streak at seven games (6-0-1).

The top streak is held by unanimous No. 1 Wisconsin, who remains unbeaten on the season at 12-0-2. Boston University is second with a nine game streak (6-0-3).

D-D-D-DEFENSE:

The Saints are the 4th-ranked team in the country in scoring defense, allowing only 1.60 goals per game.

Ak-Attack:

The 2007-08 season may have been marked by the vast offensive improvement by Tara Akstull '10, who seemed to receive the torch passed by scoring threats Sabrina Harbec and Chelsea Grills.

Akstull finished her sophomore season with the most assists in ECAC Hockey and tied for scoring in the conference as well. Her 42 points was 28 more than her rookie season. She has tallied at least one point in eight of the team's ten games.

In 89 career games, Akstull has 26 goals and 42 assists for 68 collegiate points.

"Chart"ing Success:

Much of the Saints' success this season can be traced to the fantastic play between the pipes by junior goaltender Brittony Chartier.

Chartier is eighth in the nation in both goals against average (1.59) and save percentage (.937). She has been named the ECAC Hockey Goaltender of the Week three times, including last week for her performances against Dartmouth and Harvard.

Brittony was the starting goaltender for the University of Minnesota during the Golden Gophers' run to the NCAA Tournament Finals in 2006. She has played every minute in goal for St. Lawrence thus far in 2008-09, and has a perfect 7-0-0 record when her team takes a lead into the third period.

The Saskatoon, SK native extended her active unbeaten streak last weekend to seven games, allowing only a 5-on-3 goal throughout the weekend against Dartmouth and Harvard.

Feasting in November:

Over the last 5+ seasons, the Saints have feasted on their opponents in the month of November.

Entering Friday's game against Princeton, SLU is 31-10-5 (.728) in the 11th month since 2003-04.

Through two weekends in November of 2008, the Saints are a perfect 4-0-0 with conference wins against Yale, Brown, Dartmouth and Harvard.

The Newbies:

The Saints have reloaded after losing the Class of 2008, which included forwards Chelsea Grills, Sabrina Harbec and Sarah Callan, defensemen Annie Guay and Kerri Wallace and goaltender Meaghan Guckian. The rookie class of 2012 includes six newcomers that hope to lift the Saints to the 2009 National Championship.

Forwards Alley Bero, Emma Clark and Vanessa Emond have been recruited to help endure the scoring losses left by Grills and Harbec up front. Bero, a 1st Team All-State and All-League selection each of the last four years, will look to use her speed and skills to become an immediate threat for the Saints' arsenal. In 16 games last season with the Salmon River Shamrocks, the Akwesasne, NY native scored 38 goals and added 17 assists for a 55 point season.

Clark and Emond were also consistent offensive contributors for the Culver Academy and the Dawson College Blues, respectively. Clark was the MVP and captain of her school's ice hockey team, while emond put up 65 points last season for the Blues with 34 goals and 31 assists.

Though neither Josee Belanger nor Sarianne Lynn is expected to replace All-America Annie Guay at the blue line, the Saints expect them to be able to use their size and strength to immediately add depth to the squad's defensive corps.

Finally, sophomore Nikki Bongaerts will add depth at the goaltender spot. The New Canaan, CT native led her high school team to an undefeated season in her senior campaign.

The Saints welcomed three players into the Century Club last season, as forwards Carson Duggan and Alison Domenico and defenseman Annie Guay all reached the 100+ point plateau.

Duggan became the 12th player to join the exclusive "Century Club" after racking up four goals against Brown and Yale, including a hat trick against the Bears.

The 2008-09 season is likely to see at least one addition to the "Century Club" as senior Marianna Locke enters this weekend's series only one point shy. Junior Tara Akstull also has an outside chance of reaching the 100 career point mark this season, though she is 32 points shy.

Unranked = Unphased:

The Saints put up impressive numbers throughout the 2007-08 season against unranked opponents.

The Scarlet and Brown finished with an overall mark of 23-3-0 against unranked foes, with the only losses coming to weekly vote-getters Connecticut and Boston College as well as Colgate.

Thus far in 2008-09, St. Lawrence boasts an unblemished 5-0-2 mark against unranked opponents, and will look to add to that resume against Princeton and Quinnipiac.

Rules are Rules:

The St. Lawrence University women's hockey team comes into this weekend's games against Princeton and Quinnipiac as one of the least-penalized teams in the nation (32nd of 35)

The Saints are averaging only 10.6 minutes of penalties per game (32nd of 35 teams).

Magic Number is 3:

The Saints' magic number in 2007-08 was undoubtedly 3; when the team scored 3 or more goals, they finished a perfect 26-0-0.

The number "3" continues to be close to a sure thing for the Scarlet and Brown, as they are 7-0-1 this season when scoring three or more goals.

Blue-Line Brits:

If the Saints hope to continue to be one of the best teams in the country, their defensive unit may rely on two Brits: Maschmeyer and Smith.

Maschmeyer has never missed a collegiate game since joining the Scarlet and Brown, and is coming off of a solid 2007-08 season that saw her pick up five goals and 11 assists.

Smith has arguably been the team's best defenseman since she arrived to Canton, but her offensive numbers may need a boost to help make up for Annie Guay's absence.

So far this season, both Maschmeyer and Smith have been solid on each end of the ice. Smith is tied for seventh on the team in scoring with five points (1g,4a) while Maschmeyer has four points (1g,3a).

Pouvoir à Québec:

Power to Quebec!

St. Lawrence's Quebec natives Karel Emard and Vanessa Emond have both had impressive starts to their 2008-09 seasons.

Emond has six points on a goal and five assists, with her first collegiate goal proving to be the game-winner against Yale.

Meanwhile, Emard has arguably been one of the team's best skaters, racking up five points on two goals and three assists. She does lead the team in penalties, however, with nine minors.

On Tap:

St. Lawrence will welcome WCHA foe Ohio State to Appleton Arena for the first time since January 4, 2003 next weekend for a pair of non-conference games.
